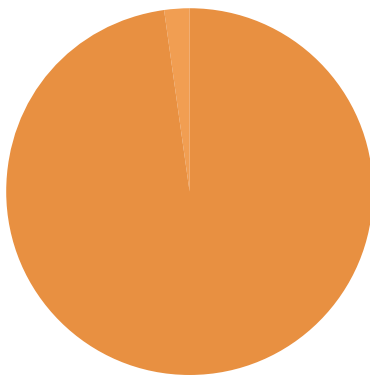

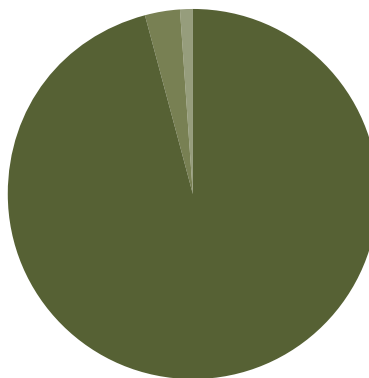

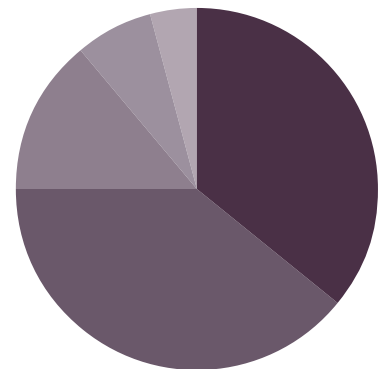
Revenue and Support

GROWING TOGETHER: PONCHA CREEK GARDENS AND CARE AND SHARE

At Poncha Creek Gardens in rural Colorado, partnering with Care and Share Food Bank has transformed both business and community outreach. Each month, Care and Share collects a fresh batch of microgreens, grown by Matt Croghan and his team, to distribute to food banks across Southern Colorado. This collaboration not only boosts local access to nutritious produce but also helps rural families who might otherwise struggle to afford it. Matt appreciates how this partnership allows him to contribute to the community while maintaining a reliable income and better work-life balance. "Being able to work with Care and Share and have it go to food banks specifically for people to access it really warms our heart," Matt shares.

For Poncha Creek Gardens, working with Care and Share has been a life-changing opportunity. The partnership enables the farm to plan for growth while stepping away from weekend markets, giving Matt more family time. As Matt puts it, "It's a win-win," allowing his family farm to thrive while making a meaningful difference in the health and nutrition of people across Southern Colorado.

"It's a win-win; it's a labor of love. It's a lot of work doing planting and harvesting and taking care of the farm every week, but that was our goal... To provide nutritious food to our community."

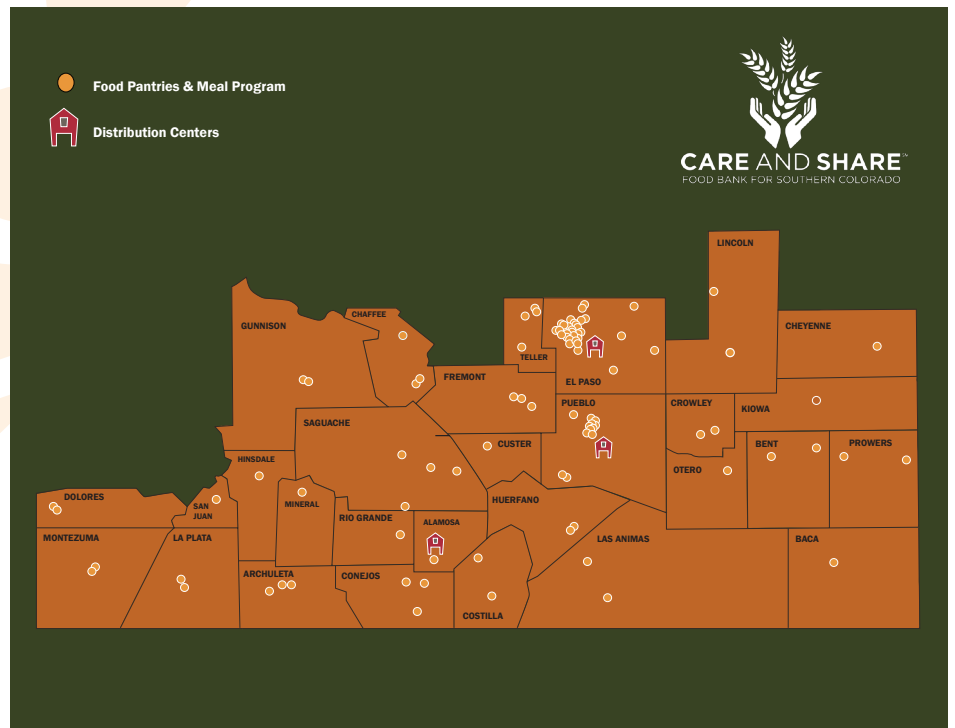
